

EDUCATOR GRANTS

Caroline Hinson, a Counselor at Ethridge Elementary in The Colony noticed an increase over the school year of how many students needed to be removed from the classroom under discipline referrals. Recognizing a need to focus on the mental health of her students, Hinson applied for and was granted a \$2,010 LEF grant to implement better mental health practices.

Enter the M&M kits - these Meaningful Meetings and Mindfulness Kits are broken into two categories. The first are Brain Break Boxes, a container full of fidget sets and items such as hoberman spheres, pop it keychains and slide puzzles that a student can use to give their mind a guick break and regulate their emotions. The second are Connection Kits designed to help teachers facilitate individual meetings with students and build stronger relationships using games, toys, and questioning stems.

MEANINGFUL MEETINGS AND **MINDFULNESS**

"Learning how to manage and process emotions can be a very difficult skill for students to master. It is something that needs to be hands on and reinforced on a regular basis," Hinson wrote in her grant proposal. "If a child cannot attend to their emotions and know how to regulate them, it makes it very difficult for them to learn and participate in class."

"Allowing the students to have access to the Brain Break Boxes on a daily basis and providing teachers learning opportunities to properly implement them in their rooms will create an environment throughout our school that focuses on equipping students with the tools that they need to manage their big feelings as well as attend to their learning and be successful in the classroom. When children's social and emotional needs are met, then they begin to flourish and thrive in the academics," says Hinson.

Every faculty member received training on the proper use of the M&M kits and a set was provided to every teacher in the building, including special education teachers and office staff. Each and every one of the 375 students at Ethridge Elementary had access to the kits and materials provided by this grant.

Using data measurement from district-approved applications as well as observing discipline referrals, the M&M Kits proved to be a success. There was a 43.5% decrease in office referrals from fall to spring semester. A survey sent out to all teachers at the end of the year showed that 77% believed the Brain Boxes were helpful while 64% believed the Connection Kits served a worthwhile purpose.





NAVAL ACADEMY GRAD GIVES BACK TO LHS

Peng Thang graduated from Lewisville High School in 2017 as a member of the growing Chin community in North Texas. The community provides deep roots for thousands of refugees, many from Burma like Thang, who are fleeing persecution in their home country. His dream was to one day graduate from the United States Naval Academy and serve his new country as part of the Marine Corps.

"The reason for me being here, my family being here, is because of those great men and women that serve this country, because of that freedom they provide," Thang said in a 2017 local news article. "They give their lives so people from a foreign country can be here freely, so I ask myself why can't I do the same thing?"

Thang has officially achieved that dream, graduating from the Naval Academy this past May, but not before deciding to give back to the community that once supported him. While he was on leave in January, he reached out to Ms. Monique Garza, a teacher at Delay Middle School and who Thang calls his American mother.

"Peng has always had a kind heart, quiet and serious demeanor (until you get to know him), motivated, but will always help people. I am always honored that he calls me mom," says Garza.

When Thang graduated from LHS, he received one of the many scholarships the Chin community has created at LEF to support graduating Chin students. In a pay-it-forward gesture, he worked with Ms. Garza to create the Peng Chin Thang JROTC Scholarship to support a JROTC student at LHS.

He donated the first installment of his newly established scholarship fund and returned to Maryland soon after. He is now at The Basic School in Virginia learning to be an Officer of the Marines. His scholarship will be awarded for the first time to a 2023 senior - only 6 years after graduating high school himself.

Lewisville ISD is on the forefront of implementing real-world solutions to ensure graduates are informed and ready for life after school. Aside from the tech centers and Career Out programs, a recent grant from TIAA allows students to complete paid internships from local companies.



go on a resume and they will be able to reference their experiences in job interviews and college applications. The program is truly remarkable and we are grateful for all of the businesses who worked with our students this summer as well as to LEF for helping make it all possible."

LISD's summer internship program works by offering businesses from around the community a spot in the program. High school juniors and seniors applied by submitting essays and teacher reccomendations.

A total of 18 students worked at businesses such as Insight Wealth Partners, Platinum Auto Glass, Free Martin Marketing and Media, BbK Services 556, Swag Angels, Stonebridge Health, Renaissance Network Reinvent, Abundance Fundraising, Warrior Doc Wellness Solutions, Novel Coffee Roasters, and Real Life Parent Guide.

"The LISD summer internship program is unique in that it offers students a glimpse into what a career will be like someday," says Lindsay Ayers, Director of Strategic Partnerships for LISD. "Students are getting to further skills that will Students learned a wide range of technical skills as well invaluable transferable skills. Paid interns worked 15-hour weeks for 6 weeks at \$12/hour.

"This internship was my first exploration into market research and social media marketing. Though very new waters, this internship allowed me to get the help I needed to learn more, strengthen my research skills, and craft an amazing research analysis," says Meghana Chinta, Lewisville High School student and intern for Novel Coffee Co and The Printed Cup. "I learned how to work professionally with others, to dive into my creative area, and to bloom far past a typical job."

While the intent for the grant was to offer real-world experience for students, the businesses also greatly benefited from the program.

"Vincent did an awesome job for us, thank you so much for helping us provide this opportunity," says Dr. Andrew Oteo of Stonebridge Health. "Liliana has been great as well, she has helped us get our social media

strategy going and we have actually seen more business come into our practice over the past few months as a direct result of her efforts. Thank you for allowing us to participate and opening our eyes to how talented these students are!"


